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# LESSON 17 Doctor and Patient

• Vocabulary: Body parts; aches and pains; frequency expressions

- Grammar: Adverbs of manner and frequency, 'never'; adjectives used as adverbs; transitive and intransitive verbs; conjunctions; subject-verb agreement (exceptions)
- Functions: Ask and talk about physical symptoms.
- Skills: Survival
- Situation: A doctor checks out a patient's problem and advises on treatment.

#### **Grammar Notes**

#### Adverbs

An *adverb* is a part of speech that modifies or qualifies a verb ('move <u>slowly</u>'), an adjective ('<u>very</u> ill'), or another adverb ('<u>very</u> well'). Adverbs can indicate manner, time, place, direction, cause, or degree and answer questions such as 'how,' 'when,' 'where,' 'how much,' 'how often,' etc. You already know *adverbs of time* such as عراين او اخر 'recently.' In this lesson, we will discuss *adverbs of manner* and *frequency*.

Adverbs of manner answer the 'how' questions. They usually include the preposition 'to' or 'with' at the beginning. Look at these examples:

'Move your arm slowly.' بازوی تان را به آهستگی حرکت بدهید.
 'I learned the lesson well.'
 'Ashraf walks fast.'

Adverbs of frequency describe how often something happens. Let's look at some examples:

'Parween's hands and feet are sometimes numb.' دست و پای پروین بعضاً بی حس است.

'Parween <u>never</u> takes medicine.' پروین <u>هیچ وقت</u> دوا نمیخور د.'

'I <u>usually</u> work too much.'

"My head <u>always</u> hurts.' or 'I <u>always</u> have headaches.'

¹ Afghans usually use the verb خور دن 'to eat' with medications, while English uses the verb 'to take.'

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Note how the adverbs of manner stay close to the verb and the adverbs of frequency close to the subject. Unlike English, Dari adverbs do not come at the end of a sentence:

'Our car passed by the hospital <u>fast</u>.'

'My left foot hurts <u>sometimes</u>.'

However, just as in English, they may appear up front (especially adverbs of time and frequency):

#### Adjectives used as adverbs

Certain adjectives can act as adverbs of manner especially in conversational Dari, even though separate adverbs may be available for the same purpose. To show this, we take the previous examples and simply substitute the adjectives for the adverbs:

'Move your arm slowly.'

'.I learned the lesson well 'I learned the lesson well."

'Ashraf walks <u>fast</u>.' اشرف <u>سریع</u> راه می رود.

In these examples, the adjectives خوب 'slow,' خوب 'good' and سريع 'fast' are used in place of adverbs. Look at an example from this lesson:

'Do you sleep <u>well</u> at night?'

'well.' نوبى 'good' is used in place of the adverb' خوب 'well.'

#### Usage of 'never'

In Dari we must use the negative form of verbs with the adverbs هيچ وقت /heych-waqt/ or هيچ وقت /har-gez/, both of which mean 'never.' This is in contrast to English where the affirmative form of verbs is used. Example:

She never goes there. (The verb 'goes' is affirmative.)

The negative form of the verb is created by adding the syllable /na/ which is shown in writing by the letter  $\upsilon$  [noon] followed by the unrepresented vowel /a/, to the beginning of the verb.

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#### Examples:

is negative.) نميخورد Parween never takes medicine.' (The verb نميخورد

is negative.) نمیرود is negative. نمیرود

Similarly, the adverbs هیچ چیز 'nothing' and هیچ کس 'nobody' also require the negative form of verbs.

#### Transitive and intransitive verbs

Verbs that take a direct object in a sentence are called *transitive verbs*. Verbs that do not take a direct object are called *intransitive verbs*. Sometimes a transitive verb can be used without a direct object. The English verb 'to move,' for example, is both transitive and intransitive, depending on how and in what context it is used. When we say, 'He moves fast,' 'move' is an *intransitive verb* because it does not take a direct object. However, when we say, 'Can you move this chair?' the same verb becomes a *transitive verb* because it has a direct object: 'chair'

In Dari, we have two different compound verbs as equivalents of 'to move': حرکت کردن (intransitive) and حرکت دادن (transitive). Here is an example of the transitive form:

'Move your arm slowly.' (There is a direct object: 'arm.')

Now, look at an example of the intransitive form:

'Do not move!' (No direct object required.)

#### **Conjunctions**

In Lesson 16, you learned how to use *conjunctions* such as 'when,' 'where' and 'that,' and you already know how to use و 'and' to connect two sentences or clauses. Other commonly used *conjunctions* in Dari are مگر اما و المار علاق المار على ا

داکتر مریض را معاینه کرد و برای او نسخه نوشت.

'The doctor examined the patient and wrote a prescription for him.'

داکتر مریض را معاینه کرد ولی برای او نسخه ننوشت.

'The doctor examined the patient but did not write a prescription for him.'

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#### **Subject-verb agreement**

In English as well as Dari, verbs must agree with their subjects. For example, if the subject is singular, it will take the singular form of the verb. Similarly, if the subject is plural, it will require the plural form of the verb. Look at the following examples:

If the subject is something *other than human beings*, the grammatically correct verb form would be plural. However, it is common in Dari, in such cases, to use the *singular* form of the verb بودن 'to be,' both in speaking and writing. Look at the following example:

In this sentence, although the subject دست ها وپاها 'hands and feet' is plural, the verb ستد 'to be' is used in its singular form استند 'is,' rather than استند 'are.' However, if we say, . it would also be correct.



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# LESSON 18 Afghan Traditions

- Vocabulary: Related to the most common life events
- Grammar: Word stress and its impact on meaning; imperative forms of 'to be' and 'to do' used in exclamations
- Functions: Express appropriate wishes/condolences according to the occasion.
- Skills: Develop a cultural awareness about Afghan traditions.
- Situations: Well-wishers talk to a host/hostess on happy or sad occasions.

### **Grammar Notes**

#### The critical role of word stress in verb forms

You know that in Dari, stress is usually placed on the last syllable of a word: كتاب / ke-taab/ 'book'; كتاب /boo-dan/ 'to be'; همايون /hu-maa-yoon/ (male name).

Word stress plays a particularly critical role in two important Dari verb forms; namely, present perfect and simple past tenses, in both their conversational and standard forms.

To illustrate this point, here is the conjugation of a verb from this lesson in the formal *present perfect tense*. Please note the highlighted syllables where the word stress falls:

/man raq-see-da am/ من رقصيده ام	'I have danced'
/too raq-see-da ee/ تو رقصيده ای	'You have danced'
/o raq-see-da ast/ او رقصیده است	'He/she has danced'
/maa raq-see-da eym/ ما رقصيده ايم	'We have danced'
/shu-maa raq-see-da eyd/ شما رقصيده ايد	'You have danced'
/aan-haa raq-see-da and/ آنها رقصيده اند	'They have danced'

Where does the stress fall? It falls on the last syllable of the past participle, before the verb ending. Next, observe the changes when we convert the formal Dari to its conversational form:

'I have danced'
'You have danced'
'He/she has danced'
'We have danced'
'You have danced'
'They have danced'

Now, the stress falls on the last syllable (the verb ending.)

The transition from *formal* to *conversational* Dari of the *present perfect tense*, then, involves three changes:

- 1. The last two syllables are combined to create a new syllable.
- 2. The vowel at the end of the third syllable is omitted.
- 3. The stress shifts to the last, combined syllable.

Now we turn to the conversational *simple past tense*. In the following example, you will notice that the stress is placed on the syllable before the last, for all persons, except for the third person singular, where the stress is placed on the last syllable:

'I danced' مه رقصیدم /ma raq-see-dum/ 'I danced' 'You danced' 'You danced' 'He/she danced' 'He/she danced' 'Me danced' 'We danced' 'We danced' 'You danced' 'You danced' 'You danced' 'They danced' 'They danced'

### **Cultural Notes**

Traditionally, Afghans use a wide range of idioms to express exclamation. Some of these idioms are complimentary and used on happy occasions: مبارک باشه! 'Congratulations!', خدا از نظر بدنگاه تان کنه! 'May God preserve you from the evil eye!' There are also idioms and remarks to express sympathy and condolences such as 'May God forgive!', خدا رحمت کنه! 'May you continue to live!', etc.

You have noticed that all of the above Dari idioms and remarks are in conversational form because they are mostly used during conversations. The verbs used in such remarks are, in most cases, the subjunctive form of the third person singular. The verbs عنه and عنه in the above examples are the subjunctive forms of بودن 'to be' and کردن to do,' respectively.

Look at the following examples from this lesson:

نازی جان، منصورجان، عروسی تان مبارک باشه!	'Dear Nazi and Mansoor, congratulations on your wedding!'
نام خدا نازی جان! چی عروس مقبولی استین! نظرنشین!	'By the grace of God, dear Nazi! What a beautiful bride you are! May you be safe from the evil eye!'
جلال جان، زندگی سرشما باشه!	'Dear Jalal, may you continue to live!'
زنده باشین!	'May you live long!' / 'Thank you!'
زندگی سر دوست ها باشه!	'May (our) friends continue to live!'

قادر جانه خدا رحمت کنه!	'May God forgive dear Qadir!'
تبریک! تولد عزیزجان تبریک!	'Congratulations! Congratulations on dear Aziz's birth!'
ماشاالله! چى طفل مقبولى! خدا نگاهش كنه!	'May God preserve him from the evil eye! What a beautiful baby! May God save him!'
عبدالله جان، نامزدی تان مبارک باشه!	'Dear Abdullah, congratulations on your engagement!'
چى عروس مقبولى!	'What a beautiful bride!'
چی غذا های خوشمزه ای!	'What delicious foods!'

The ceremonies associated with Afghan weddings differ from one part of the country to another. In the capital and bigger cities, wedding parties are usually arranged at the ballroom of a hotel, a banquet hall, a big restaurant, etc. In smaller towns and villages where such facilities are not available, wedding festivities usually take place in homes. In any case, the expenses of the wedding ceremony are paid for by the groom's family.

Engagement parties are similar to wedding parties but smaller in size and are held either at a hotel, banquet hall, restaurant, or at the home of the bride's family. All the costs related to the engagement party are covered by the bride's family.

In both wedding and engagement parties, there will be plenty of food consisting of various Afghan dishes, music, and dancing. Men, women, and children attending such festivities wear new and fancy clothes.

Afghan funerals are similar to those of most other Islamic countries. The body of the deceased person having been thoroughly washed, is wrapped in a clean white cloth called كفن /ka-fan/ and placed inside a wooden coffin. The coffin is then carried to a mosque or an open area large enough to accommodate the participants of the 'نصار جنال 'special prayer for the dead (corpse).' As soon as the prayer is over, the funeral procession moves to the cemetery where the burial takes place after the eulogy and recital of some verses from the Holy Qur'an. At the end of the burial, all the people in attendance express their condolences to the survivors and relatives of the deceased and leave. Afghan funerals are usually attended by men. However, women can also attend funerals, but they will have to stand behind the men and slightly apart from them.

For two days following the funeral, special prayer sessions called فاتحه /faa-te-ha/ are held at the mosque.

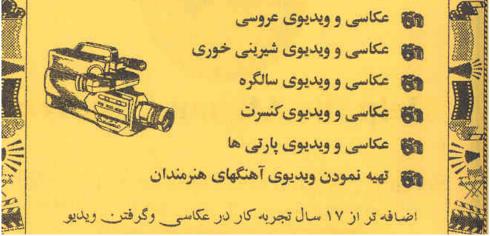



# LESSON 19 At a Hotel

### **Grammar Notes**

### **Yes-No questions**

There are two types of questions one can ask: Yes-No and information seeking. You already know an easy way to create a Yes-No question by simply raising the intonation. The example below illustrates the change from statement to question. The shaded syllables show where the stress falls:

'The rooms have bathrooms.'

'Do the rooms have bathrooms?' اتاق ها تشناب دارن؟

In formal Dari, Yes-No questions are formed by adding the particle 'i/aa-yaa/ at the beginning of the sentence. This particle is especially useful in written texts where intonation is not available to help the reader establish meaning.

/aa-yaa u-taaq-haa tash-naab daa-rand/ آیا اتاق ها تشناب دا رند؟

'Do the rooms have bathrooms?' (Again, the shaded syllables show where the stress falls.)

Now compare the following and identify the conversational and the formal versions:

### Usage of particle in indirect speech

In English, when converting a Yes-No question from direct speech to indirect, or reported speech, we usually use the words 'whether' or 'if.' Let's look at a couple of examples in English:

### Direct speech

Karim asks Farooq: 'Does your room have a bathroom?' Najib asks Asad: 'Is there a swimming pool in the hotel?'

### Indirect (reported) speech

Karim asks Farooq whether his room has a bathroom. Najib asks Asad if there is a swimming pool in the hotel.

Now see how the above sentences are said in Dari. Note that in indirect speech, the particle ji is always preceded by the word 'L' that':

Direct speech

کریم از فاروق می پرسد': " اتاقت تشناب دارد؟" نجیب از اسد می پرسد: " در هوتل حوض آببازی هست؟"

### Indirect (reported) speech

کریم از فاروق می پرسد که آیا اتاقش تشناب دارد. نجیب از اسد می پرسد که آیا در هوتل حوض آبیازی هست.

#### Questions with question words

We can also ask questions to seek specific information using *interrogatives*:

رستوران چطوراست؟ 'How is the restaurant?' در هوتل خود چه داريد؟ 'What do you have in your hotel?' چند اتاق ضرورت دارید؟ 'How many rooms do you need?' 'Who are you?' ('Who is calling?') شما کی استید؟ اتاق یکنفری فی شب چند است؟ 'How much is the single room per night?' اتاق در کجاست؟ 'Where is the room?' به نام <u>کی</u> ریزرف کنم؟ 'In whose name should I make the reservation?' باکی گپ میزنم؟ 'Whom am I talking to?' چرا اینقدر قیمت است؟ 'Why is it so expensive?' كدام منزل را خوش داريد؟ 'Which floor would you like?' اتاق من در طبقه عندم است؟ 'What floor is my room on?'

Note that when asking questions about the size or capacity of something in terms of how many people it contains or can accommodate, we use the question word چند نفری, which

-

roughly means 'of the size of how many people' or 'having how many people.' For example:

'How big (what size) are your classes?' ('How many students are there in your classes?')

Here is an example from this lesson:

'What size room do you want?' اتاق چند نفري ميخايين؟

### 'since…' از… به اینطرف since…'

As discussed in Lesson 15, Dari speakers commonly use the *simple present tense* to indicate *present perfect* or *present progressive* action. To show action in the present perfect progressive tense, the addition of the prepositional phrase 'ز... به اینطرف' 'since...' helps establish that an action or event is ongoing. You will notice this combination of 'since...' and simple present tense in each of the following examples:

نجیب ازماه گذشته به اینطرف در هوتل آریانا اقامت دارد <sub>.</sub>	'Najib has been staying at the Ariana Hotel since last month.'
من <u>از</u> ساعت هشت صبح <u>به اینسو</u> در اتاقم هستم	'I have been in my room since 8 o'clock in the morning.'
کریم ا <u>ز</u> ساعت ده دیشب <u>به اینطرف</u> خواب است.	'Karim has been sleeping since 10 o'clock last night.'
ایرکندیشن این اتاق <u>از</u> دوروزیه اینطرف کارنمیکند.	'This room's air conditioning has not been working for the last two days (since two days ago.)'
فامیل کریم ازده سال به اینطرف در آلمان زندگی میکنند.	'Karim's family has been living in Germany for the last ten years (since ten years ago.)'

#### Transition to conversational Dari

When using the verb ماندن 'to remain/to stay' in *imperative* or *subjunctive* form (only), Dari speakers often shorten the verb by one syllable. To shorten this verb first the /m/ sound from the verb بماند (represented by the letter ع ) is dropped. Then, the /d/ sound is replaced with the sound /a/ (represented by the letters ع /daal/ and ه /hey/ respectively) in the verb ending.

#### Formal

"Karim might stay in Kabul for a week." ممكن است كريم يك هفته در كابل بماند

### Conversational

'Karim might stay in Kabul for a week.'

Notice that the personal pronouns in the left column have taken the particle \( \) /raa/ while their short forms in the center column have not. It must also be noted that when used with compound verbs, like the above examples, the short forms of personal pronouns usually follow the first element of the compound verb.

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# **LESSON 20** Renting a House

- Vocabulary: Related to real estate: houses, rooms, amenities, rent
- Grammar: Passive voice; compound sentences; relative clauses
- Functions: Find out details about rental properties.

- Situation: An employee of the American embassy talks with a real estate agent about a suitable place for a diplomat who will arrive soon.

#### **Grammar Notes**

#### **Compound sentences**

The most basic sentence type is called *simple*. A *simple* sentence is made up of only one clause. In other words, a *simple* sentence has only one verb. Example:

We can make more interesting sentences with two or more clauses that are connected by a conjunction, such as و 'and,' ولى 'but,' که 'that /who /which,' یا 'or,' etc. Such sentences are called *compound* sentences. Note the shaded conjunctions and the underlined verbs in the following examples:

'Please go to the real estate office or call them.'

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The verb نوشته شده 'has been written' is the present perfect tense of the verb نوشته شده 'to write' in the passive voice for the third person singular. As explained in Lesson 12, the personal verb ending است is dropped in this instance. The complete form would be نوشته شده است

#### Passive voice

In grammar, the relationship between the subject and the verb is called *voice*. In the *active voice*, the subject performs the action of the verb. In the *passive voice*, the subject is acted upon or done to.

Let's look at the statement 'They painted the house.' It is in the *active voice*: the subject (they) performed the action (paint.) Compare this statement to 'The house was painted.' It is in the *passive voice*: the subject (house) is acted upon and does not perform the action (paint.) In the *passive voice*, the verb indicates what the subject <u>undergoes</u>, not what it does.

In Dari, the *passive voice* is mostly constructed with the help of the auxiliary verb شدن 'to become.' Three different forms are shown below:

<u>Infinitive</u>	<u>Present stem</u>	Past stem
شدن	شو	شد

Let's look at the conjugation of the verb شدن in various tenses:

#### Present tense

من میشوم	'I become'
تو میشوی	'You become'
او میشو د	'He/She/It becomes'
ما میشویم	'We become'
شما میشوید	'You become'
آنها میشوند	'They become'

#### Past tense

من شدم	'I became'
تو شدی	'You became'
اوشد	'He/She/It became'
ما شدیم	'We became'
شما شدید	'You became'
آنها شدند	'They became'

#### Future tense

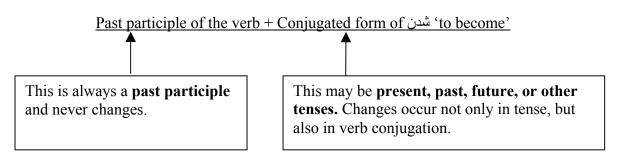
'I will become'
'You will become'
'He/She/It will become'
'We will become'
'You will become'
'They will become'

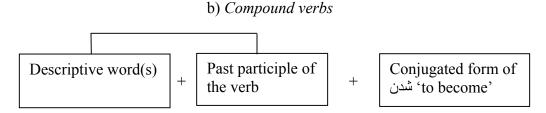

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Compound verbs —those consisting of descriptive word(s) added to a verb—follow the same formula, but with one additional component up front:



For example, the compound verb آباد کر دن 'to build' consists of the adjective 'habitable' and the verb کر دن 'to do.' To construct the passive voice of this compound verb, we use the past participle of کر دن, which is مُدرن, with the conjugated form of مُدرن. Notice the sequence of Adjective + Participle + Conjugated verb:

Now confirm your understanding of the passive voice construction by examining the word order and verb tenses in these examples:

Present tense این خانه برای مدت یک سال به کرایه داده میشود.	'This house is being rented for a period of one year.'
Present perfect tense تشناب اخير أتغيير ساختمان داده شده است.	'The bathroom has been remodeled recently.'
Future tense اتاق خواب در هفته ٔ آینده رنگ کرده خواهد شد.	'The bedroom will be painted next week.'
Present subjunctive mood آشپزخانه باید پیش از آخر هفته تر میم کر ده شود.	'The kitchen must be repaired before the weekend.'
Future tense negative خانه های نوبامبل و فرنیچر به کرایه داده نخواهند شد.	'The new houses will not be rented furnished.'

As you saw in the preceding examples, the verb شدن 'to become,' depending on the tense in which it was used, changed its form, while the basic structure of the formula remained intact.

Most of the Dari compound verbs contain the helping verb کردن 'to do,' such as לעני 'to rent,' לעני 'to rent,' לעני 'to repair,' ווּוּר אַרָבי 'to paint,' ענים 'to paint,' ווּוּר אַרָבי 'to build,' etc. When constructing the passive voice of such compound verbs, we often omit the past participle of אַרַני , which is אַרָני , in both formal and conversational Dari, just to make the sentence shorter while its meaning remains unchanged. Look at the shortened versions of previous examples:

آن خانه ها در این او اخر آباد شده اند.	'Those houses have been built recently.'
اتاق خواب در هفته ٔ آینده رنگ خواهد شد.	'The bedroom will be painted next week.'
آشپزخانه باید پیش از آخر هفته ترمیم شود.	'The kitchen must be repaired before the weekend.'

#### Relative clauses

A relative clause is a group of words with a subject and a verb that modify a noun or pronoun. Relative clauses begin with the word 'that / who / which' and describe the preceding noun or pronoun in some detail. Examples:

'This house is going to be for an American diplomat who has recently arrived in Kabul.

'Have you read the advertisement for the rental houses that has been written in the newspaper?'

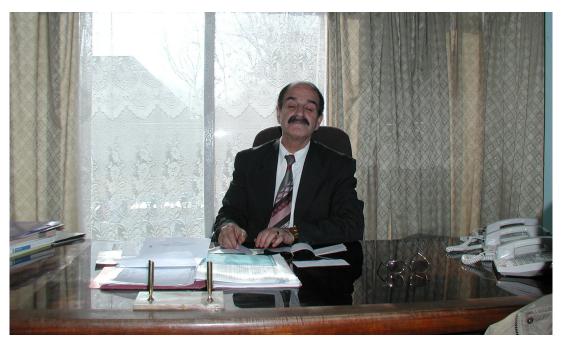

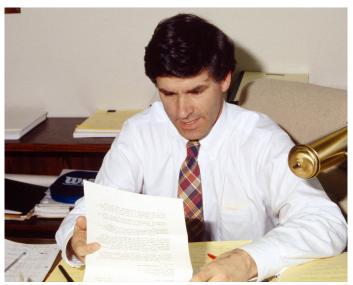
