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Lesson 41

Pa-an/han/nan Verbs (Double-doer-verbs)

1. Definition and function

Like some other verbs in previous lessons, **pa-an/han/nan verbs also belong to the double-doer verbs**. They are used when someone lets/allows/wants someone else to do something. The focus of these verbs is on the indirect object, object of the preposition or location of the action. Sometimes the direct object and/or the second doer is not mentioned in the sentence but it is implied. The easiest way to form **pa-an/han/nan verbs** is to prefix **pa** to locative **an/han/nan verbs**.

Examples:

1. Paaayusan ni Lina si Pinang sa pinakamahusay na beautician sa bayan natin sa gabi ng parangal sa kanya bilang Bb. Pilipinas.
Lina will have the best beautician in our town put make-up on Pinang on the night honoring her as Bb. Pilipinas.
2. Pahahalinhan ka raw niya kay Flor.
S/he said that she will have Flor replace you temporarily.
3. Pabalikan mo nga kay Wilma ang bag na naiwan ko sa opisina.
Could you please ask Wilma to go back for the bag that I forgot in the office.
4. Kanino pinaaalagaan ni Osang ang anak niya kung nasa trabaho siya?
To whom does Osang entrust the care of her child while she is at work?
5. Huwag mong paasahan sa tulong mo si Mely kung hindi ka siguradong matutulungan mo siya.
Do not let Mely rely on/hope for your help if you are not sure that you can help her.
6. Hindi nga pababawasan ang ating suweldo, pero dadagdagan naman ang ating trabaho.
It is true that they won't have our salaries decreased, but, instead they will increase our work (load). (there's a hint of dissatisfaction and reproach in this statement)
7. Sino ang pahahatdan mo ng mga regalong ito?
To whom are you having these gifts sent?
8. O sige, palagdaan mo na ang mga papeles na ito sa abogado nang maipamahagi na natin sa mga kinauukulan ang kanilang namana.
Okay, have these papers signed by the lawyer so we can distribute to those concerned what they inherited.
9. Huwag mong palapitan ang aso sa bata at baka siya kagatin nito.
Don't let the child approach the dog for it might bite her/him.
10. Pinalinisan na ba ninyo ang mga kuwarto para sa mga bisita?
Did you already have the rooms cleaned for the visitors?
11. Pinapalitan ni Didi ang blusang kabibili lang niya kasi masyado raw itong masikip sa kanya.
Didi had the blouse that she just bought exchanged because she said that it is too tight for her.

5. Pa-an/han/nan verbs derived from ma-verbs

A few **ma-verbs** and **maki-social verbs** can be transformed into **pa-an/han/nan verbs** but these verbs are not double-doer verbs. The focus is still on the object of the preposition. Some of these verbs are:

6. Able pa-an/han/nan verbs

The two forms of **pa-an/han/nan verbs** can be made into verbs expressing ability, possibility, and opportunity by prefixing **ma** to the verbs. Sentence patterns remain the same for all verbs. Below are a few examples of such verbs.

Were you able to ask Wendy to put the lid on the bottle of soy sauce? Will you please check because it (the liquid) might spill if it does not have a lid (the bottle).
6. Mapapatingnan na ni Lenny ang anak niya sa doktor dahil sa nakahiram siya ng pera sa nanay niya.
Lenny will now be able to have the doctor see/treat her child because she was able to borrow money from her mother.
7. Mapapaturuan mo si Eric kay Angel dahil sa matiyaga si Angel sa pagtuturo sa kanyang kapatid.
You can ask Angel to teach Eric because Angel is patient in teaching his brother.
8. Wala ka nang dapat gawin para sa party. Napaanyayaan ko nang lahat ang mga kaibigan at mga kamag-anak natin kay Fe.
There's nothing more for you to do for the party. I was able to ask Fe to invite all our friends and relatives.
9. Hindi ko mapapakialaman ang dalawang iyon at parehong mainit ang ulo nila.
I can't meddle with those two because both of them are hot tempered.
10. Mapapakinggan ko na naman ang sermon ni Poldo kung pupunta ako doon.

Lesson 42

Pag-in/hin/nin and Papag-in/hin/nin Verbs

1. Definition and Function

Some **pag-in/hin/nin-verbs** and their variants, **papag-in/hin/nin-verbs** are double-doer verbs derived from **mag-verbs**. Like **pa-in/hin/nin-verbs**, their focus is on the second doer, therefore it is the second doer which takes the **Set I markers**. A few **pag-in/hin/nin-verbs** and **papag-in/hin/nin-verbs** are double-object verbs derived from **i-verbs** and they focus on the objects of the sentence. These verbs are used when someone wants to have something done either by command or request. Remember that objects can be both people and inanimate objects. It must also be noted here that not all **mag-verbs** and **i-verbs** will take these affixes. The aspects of double-doer verbs and double-object verbs are the same but the sentence patterns are slightly different.

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Lesson 43

Pag-an/han/nan verbs

1. Definition and Function

Pag-an/han/nan verbs are derived from **mag-verbs** and **i-verbs**. They focus on either the object in the sentence or on the object of the preposition or direction of the action, which translates into English as prepositions like *in*, *at*, *about*, etc. The aspects and sentence patterns are the same whether the resulting **pag-an/han/nan verbs** are derived from **mag-verbs** or **i-verbs**.

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Lesson 44

Comparison of All Focuses

In this lesson, we will compare all the different focuses we have learned in this course. There are more focuses in Filipino, but they are not as important or as commonly used as the ones that you have studied so far. You will learn them from context as you do your own reading and studying to maintain your language. You have learned that one English sentence can be expressed in Filipino in many different ways by changing the focus of the sentence. We will try to compare all those focuses together in this lesson. The sentences marked with an asterisk are more commonly used and preferred. The sentences given are all used often when no asterisk is written. The focus of the sentence is in **bold**.

1. Lina is playing the “Blue Danube.”

The examples given in this lesson should guide you in transforming sentences from one focus into another. In all cases, you must bear in mind that certain situations can only be expressed in one way while other situations can be expressed in many different ways. Native speakers do not stop to think about focus when creating their own sentences; usage by the majority of Filipinos determine which focus is most appropriate for certain situations or context, and they use this instinctively. Listening to native speakers and reading authentic materials will enhance your ability to understand and use Filipino like native speakers.

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Note: I did not cite specific pages because I only referred to the books to verify the correctness and accuracy of my own observation and to clarify some grammar points presented in the old syllabus.

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
